RINGSTONE IN AVELAND GROUP READER - Explanation by Fr Graham

"Reader ministry in the Church of England is a special form of accredited lay ministry. After about three years part-time, but intensive and demanding study, a person is licensed and commissioned by the Bishop for Reader ministry in the Church. A Reader can preside at Morning and Evening Prayer, at All Age Worship, can help administer holy communion, but not preside at the Eucharist [only a priest or bishop can do that]. Readers also exercise ministry in Residential Homes, and take holy communion to the sick and housebound in their homes. After additional study, a Reader may be authorised to preside at Funerals as well. But the main emphasis of Reader ministry is as a Minister of the Word, and to this end a Reader will proclaim the Gospel at the Eucharist, and be licensed by the Bishop to deliver homilies at any service, and to teach. Into this ministry Judy Watson was admitted, licensed and commissioned on 13 October by Bishop John, the Bishop of Lincoln at his Cathedral Church at Lincoln. As a sign of this validation by the Church, Judy was vested in the distinctive blue scarf of the Reader. Though Judy is from Kirkby Underwood, she is a gift for the whole Group, and has been licensed for the whole Group [and not just, or even, Morton, as erroneously suggested by one diocesan newspaper!] From 14 October, Judy has been functioning in our Group as a Reader. That's what she will be doing. What we will be doing is to lend her our support, our good wishes and, most importantly, our prayers, for this exciting new ministry upon which she has embarked."

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH - Information received 11.10.07

A number of distraction type offences have occurred in the Lincolnshire Forces area, at Deeping St James, Bourne and Boston, where bogus officials are purporting to be from British Gas or the Waterboard. A young male with fair hair was seen, wearing a jacket and trousers, with an Irish accent in suspicious circumstances, heading towards the village centre of Dowsby.

As a result of this incident whereby a member of the public was defrauded of a large sum of money, this message is sent to highlight the problem of offences committed from abroad with local victims. The offence is part of a long running scam, whereby victims receive correspondence advising them that they have won the Canadian Lottery, then asked to pay an administration fee to release their winnings. Victims have arranged payment via an electronic bank transfer then hear nothing more. There are numerous variations on the same theme, eg a similar scam with the French National Lotto, and a horse racing syndicate, where victims are invited to place bets via a credit card hotline with a guaranteed win, only to find that their credit card accounts have been emptied and the offenders have vanished without trace. The offenders tend to target elderly vulnerable people. IF WE LOSE THE POST OFFICE, WE LOSE THE SHOP!

Closure of Rippingale Branch Post Office

By the time you read this, we expect that everyone in the village will know that Rippingale is scheduled to lose its 'Branch Post Office' at the shop. **If we lose the Post Office, the shop will no longer be viable and we will lose that as well!** An Outreach service will not in any way serve the needs of the village and will not keep the shop alive!

The consultation ends on 12th November 2007 by which time ALL petitions, letters and emails must be RECEIVED by the Post Office – that's only just over a week from now (1st November).

A major thank-you from the 'Friends of Rippingale Post Office' for all the support and help that so many of you have already given so far.

At the time of writing (Sunday 14th October) the petition in the shop is doing very well with over 800 signatures, but the Downing Street online e-petition to the Prime Minister is sadly lacking. We need more than 200 signatures for action to be taken, and it currently stands at less than 180. We do hope that we will have exceeded 200 by the time you read this but there are many prominent names missing. If you have access to a computer and an email address and haven't yet signed, PLEASE do so now! (Remember to click on the link sent to you in an email from the e-petitions website otherwise your signature will not be accepted). The address of the e-petition is " <http://petitions.pm.gov.uk/Rippingale/> ", or go to the village website and follow the links.

To date (14 October) the "Friends of Rippingale Post Office" have not only organised the petitions and letters, but have carried out an intense media campaign highlighting our fight both locally, and nationally with a number of interviews including a slot on "Calendar" on Yorkshire Television as well as local radio stations and press releases. Some 250 villagers turned out on a wet Saturday morning to see Quentin Davies MP, and his probable successor to parliament Nick Boles, Conservative PPC for Grantham and Stamford, who visited the shop on 13th October. The planned walk to Morton Post Office along the A15 on Wednesday 17th October should disrupt traffic enough to make national road reports as well as news. To date we are the strongest action group in the country – let's keep it that way!

What can you do to help?

The simplest thing is to sign both petitions. The shop petition has copies in the Bull and at the Doctors' Surgery as well as at the shop.

STOP PRESS Thursday 18th October 2007 (Thank you Mary)

Protest walk to Morton Post Office – Wednesday 17th October

The walk was a tremendous success; more than 100 villagers started from Rippingale Post Office, and 85 reached Morton.

We had very good coverage from BBC Look North, ITV Central and ITV Yorkshire Television News teams, with coverage in both lunchtime and evening news editions. It is unfortunate that both ITV channels let the post office representative, Michael Dalton, get away with evading Rippingale's specific case, and not pointing out that Outreach is not a workable alternative.

A big thank you goes out to all those who came on the march, those who gave their time to act as marshals and to the Police who provided escort cover.

Outreach

PO Ltd say they're not forcing anyone to walk to Morton as they are giving us an "Outreach" Service!

The options are; 1 - asking Simon to Host a counter in the village shop with a business partner, 2 – other premises like the Village Hall or The Bull hosting a counter, or 3 – a mobile office visiting the village.

PO Ltd visited Simon a month before the 1st October closure was announced, introduced him to a potential partner, who then made what can be best described as an insulting offer, guaranteeing the shop wouldn't survive.

The service would be for 13 hours a week only, and all would be very limited – no post over 2 kg, no special delivery, no business banking, no transactions without a bar coded bill, no foreign currency. Is this what you want? It is certainly of little or no use to the local businesses.

Online E-petition to the Prime Minister

We have made the minimum 200 signatures required; the target is now **500**. If you haven't signed yet and are able to do so, now is the time to do it – the more signatures, the greater the impact and response from Number Ten. If you do not have an email address, please see below. – there's no excuse!

Internet Surgeries

For those who would like to sign the petition to the Prime Minister but do not have access to the internet or an email address, we plan to set up drop-in surgeries where you can come and get signed up. Please ask at the Shop for more details or contact any member of "Friends of Rippingale Post Office" who will be pleased to help.
